HAVE YOU SEEN A TAGGED SEEN A

WHAT ARE TAGS?

Tags are numbered clips that are fastened onto a turtle that allow us to know who the turtle is and where it has come from.

Turtles typically carry 2 tags.

They are usually attached on the front flipper in the "armpit" area, but may be on the rear flippers.

WHAT SHOULD YOU DO IF YOU SEE A TAGGED TURTLE?

If the turtle is alive:

Write down the information on both sides of each tag. Leave the tags on the turtle and release it. Mail the information to the address on the tag.

If the turtle is dead:

Remove the tags, flatten them and mail them to the address on the tags.

WHAT INFORMATION IS IMPORTANT?

Where and when the turtle was seen and what it was doing. A measurement of shell length is useful too.

WHAT'S IN IT FOR YOU?

If you provide a name and address, a **reward** will be sent in return for the information or tags.
