
<u>Lepidochelys</u> <u>olivacea</u>: Olive ridley (Eng), Golfina (Sp), Tortue olivâtre (Fr)



Physical Characteristics

- <u>Length-adult</u>: Carapace (upper shell) length of 2-2.5 ft (ca. 60-75 cm)
- <u>Length-hatchling</u>: Carapace length of 1.5-2 in (ca. 38-50 mm)
- Weight: 75-110 lb (ca. 35-50 kg)
- <u>Color-adult</u>: Carapace dark grey/green; Plastron (belly) yellowish-white
- Color-hatchling: Uniform in color, grayish black

Caribbean Reproduction/Nesting

- <u>Peak nesting</u>: April-August
- <u>Number of nests</u>: On average, 1-2 times per season at 17-30 day intervals
- Average clutch size: 105-115 eggs per nest
- Incubation time: about 55 days

Global Status

Endangered (World Conservation Union: IUCN Red List); international trade is prohibited by CITES; Protected (Annex II) by the Protocol concerning Specially Protected Areas and Wildlife (SPAW) to the UNEP Cartagena Convention; Protected by the Interamerican Convention for the Protection and Conservation of Sea Turtles.
