Prospectus: Climate Change and Marine Turtles

Purpose

Strengthen capacity in the Wider Caribbean Region to incorporate climate change vulnerability assessment and adaptation action into ongoing marine turtle research and conservation projects

Objectives

- 1. Examine threats related to climate change to marine turtles and their habitats
- 2. Explore tools for monitoring and assessing the vulnerability of critical habitat to climate change impacts
- **3.** Explore and prioritize issues, opportunities, and needs with respect to incorporating the variable of climate change into sea turtle projects in the Wider Caribbean
- 4. Promote collaboration and support for vulnerability assessment and adaptation work on sea turtle nesting beaches in the Wider Caribbean
- 5. Explore opportunities and mechanisms for data-sharing at international levels

Outcomes

- 1. A better understanding among Caribbean sea turtle biologists, managers and policy-makers of (i) the potential negative impacts of climate change on coastal habitats critical to the survival of endangered sea turtles, and (ii) actions that can be taken to minimize these impacts
- A commitment among Caribbean sea turtle project leaders to (i) incorporate adaptation measures (=any action taken to reduce vulnerability to the negative impacts of climate change) in their study areas, and (ii) to encourage broader implementation of adaptation measures nation-wide
- **3.** A strong collaborative base for vulnerability assessment and adaptation work at sea turtles nesting sites in the Wider Caribbean (the aim here is that people who wish to incorporate vulnerability assessment and/or adaptation measures into their projects will know who else is doing so, and can offer mutual support by sharing successes/ failures, lessons learned, etc.)
- 4. Preliminary plans to share and collaboratively archive/access data

Materials

The workshop will be based on the materials included in an "Adaptation to Climate Change Toolkit" available (English, Spanish) at <u>http://www.panda.org/lac/marineturtles/adaptation</u> and will include presentations, exercises, group discussion and practical training in monitoring techniques. Toolkits will be provided to each organization participating in the workshop.





2010 Working Groups

Working Groups (WGs) provide a forum for discussing topics of interest with colleagues and experts. WGs often develop recommendations for new programmatic directions that we can focus on as a WIDECAST family. The regional tagging centre in Barbados, the nesting beach atlas, our database management software, attention to bycatch issues, models of eco-tourism and community crafting, and building capacity for responding to sick and injured sea turtles, among many other initiatives, all emerged from recommendations made by WGs that met at an annual meeting. Sometimes WGs convene simply for informal discussion on a topic of shared interest, without any intention of drafting recommendations or decisions. Enjoy!
