




Patrolled Turtle Beaches & Participating Schools



The 2010 sea turtle census took place at 9 nesting beaches. Clockwise from the southwest, these locations were: Les Pointe, Layou, Mero, Coulibistrie, Picard Beach, Douglas Bay, Londonderry Beach, Rosalie Beach [see photo insert], and Bout Sable (La Plaine) Beach.

- IFAW, DomSeTCO, Youth Division, Caribwhale, Dive Operators




- IFAW's Clearing the Way for Turtles Project came in 2nd in online voting
