# 2012 Working Groups

Working Groups (WGs) provide a forum for discussing topics of interest with colleagues and experts. WGs often develop recommendations for new programmatic directions that we can focus on as a WIDECAST family. The Regional Tagging Centre in Barbados, atlas of sea turtle nesting beaches, database management software, attention to bycatch issues, models of ecotourism and community crafting, guidelines for responding to sick & injured sea turtles, standard methodologies for monitoring nesting and foraging populations, among many other initiatives, all emerged from recommendations made by WGs that met at an annual meeting. A WG may also convene simply for informal discussion on a topic of shared interest, without any intention of drafting recommendations or decisions.
